On November 11, 2021, a CJK IFLA/PAC Centre meeting was held with the directors of three regional centers—IFLA-PAC China Center, IFLA PAC Korea Center, and IFLA/PAC Regional Centre for Asia—in attendance. The meeting was convened by the IFLA/PAC Regional Centre for Asia in order to give the directors of the regional centers an opportunity to hold an online conference. During the meeting, each center reported on its recent activities. These three centers were able to exchange information and strengthen their cooperative relationships through this online meeting.

From December 21, 2021, to January 17, 2022, a video of the 32nd Preservation Forum entitled "Disaster preparedness for library materials" was available online and viewed by 222 people. At the Forum, six presenters reported on material disaster prevention in museums, university libraries, public libraries and the NDL. They also gave a presentation on how to deal with water-damaged materials and training.

- ➤ UNESCO held a regional workshop as part of its Memory of the World (MoW) program both online and on-site in Saly, Senegal, from June 15 to 17, 2021. At the workshop, Ms. KOBAYASHI Naoko, former senior librarian of the National Diet Library, made a presentation about disaster preparedness at the National Diet Library. The IFLA/PAC Asia Regional Centre assisted in the preparation of the materials for this presentation (Cf. PAC Regional Centre for Asia Annual Report 2020-2021).
- On September 21-22, 2021, we attended the 2nd Memory of the World Global Policy Forum on Disaster Risk Reduction and Management for Sustainable Preservation of Documentary Heritage online.

- On November 11, 2021, a CJK IFLA/PAC Centre meeting (online) was held with the directors of three regional centers—IFLA-PAC China Center, IFLA PAC Korea Center, and IFLA/PAC Regional Centre for Asia—in attendance. During the meeting, each center reported on its recent activities. The IFLA-PAC China Center reported on the restoration of ancient books, construction of a database of ancient Chinese books, and development of human resources for restoration. The IFLA PAC Korea Center reported on its digitization and conservation of LP record albums and other analog media, as well as floppy disks and other digital media. The IFLA/PAC Regional Center for Asia reported on its facilities and equipment for disaster prevention, disaster prevention measures for its materials, and recent cooperation activities related to the preservation of materials.
  - Opinions were exchanged on deacidification of acid paper, cooperative activities related to the preservation of ancient books, and training in the preservation of materials.
- Mr. NAGAI Yoshikazu, director of the PAC/Asia, attended the IFLA/PAC Section Standing Committee Zoom meetings.
