### 1. General Overview

The mission of the National Library of Indonesia (NLI) is to guide, develop and make the most of all kinds of libraries; preserve references (printed and recorded) as nation's cultural achievements; and to provide library services to all. Indonesian Government has set up 11 (eleven) national priority programs as stated in the National Medium Term Development Plan (RPJM National) 2009-2014. The library development program belongs to the 11<sup>th</sup> program which is under the Field of "Culture, Creativity and Technological Innovation". Targets to be achieved in the library development programs are:

- Providing reading materials to develop reading habit and culture of the society
- Improving ITC based library services throughout the country
- Improving the quality and capacity of the library throughout the country to support lifelong education
- Preserving and utilizing the national intellectual works.

### 2. Relationship with Government and Legislations

NLI is a non-ministerial government institution. NLI is responsible directly to the President of the Republic of Indonesia while in performing its operational duties, NLI is under the coordination of the Minister of Education and Culture. NLI's mandate is set out in the Deposit Act No. 4 1990, Regulation No. 70 1991 and Library Act No. 43 2007.

#### **4. New Developments in Creating and Building Collections**

In creating and building its collections, NLI has done the following programs:

- a. In the year 2010, NLI has successfully produced 500 volumes of historical maps which have been converted into digital formats (31 CDs) and 1.000 old photographs. NLI has also digitized 8.331 pages of old newspapers and 1.250 volumes of ancient manuscripts and 750 volumes of rare books.
- b. In the year 2012, NLI digitized 1.000 titles of old newspaper, 5.000 pages of current newspaper, and 330 titles of rare magazine, 530 titles of rare book, 1.330 titles of manuscripts, 1.500 titles of maps and 3.000 pieces of historical photographs.
- c. In the year of 2013, NLI will digitize 320 titles of old magazine, 330 titles of rare books, 4.000 pieces of historical photographs, 1.600 titles of ancient manuscripts, 325 titles of maps and 1600 titles of old newspapers.

#### **5. New Developments in Managing Collections**

In managing its collections, NLI has also done the following:

- a. Developing the Indonesian National Digital Library  
For the initial project all provincial libraries are requested to submit 400 files of their local contents (100 files for books and the other 300 files can be in the forms of photos, pictures, videos, texts etc)
- b. Developing Online Union Catalogue (1,841,754 records) (<http://kin.pnri.go.id>) and National Bibliography (1.495.132 records) (<http://bni.pnri.go.id>)
- c. Developing Web Archiving (2.327 Websites) (<http://arsipweb.pnri.go.id>)
- d. Developing Data Center
  1. More than 55 servers; web server, application server, data base server, repository management server, connectivity management server & network management server, data center management server.
  2. Storage capacity is around 30Terabytes.
  3. Developing Data Recovery Center including backup and recovery system.
  4. Developing 37 thematic web portal, like as about Presidents, Temples, Films, Literatures, Batavia Digital, Indonesia Librarian and Librarianship etc.

#### **6. New Developments in Providing Access to Collections**

Starting in 2008, NLI has subscribed e-journal and e-books intended to be accessed by public from the 33 Provincial Libraries, 2 Presidential Libraries and 355 District Libraries. Till the year of 2013, NLI subscribes 10.095 titles of e-book from various publishers and 31 subjects of e-journal from various publisher like as EBSCO, GALE, INGRAM, IGI GLOBAL, WESTLAW, PROQUEST, TAYLOR & FRANCIS, LEXIS & NEXIS, SAGE and local publisher Balai Pustaka.

In order to achieve its targets, NLI has initiated to revitalize the library services through developing e-Library Program as follows:

- a. Developing closed network to the 35 nodes representatives of 33 Provincial Libraries, 2 Presidential Libraries and 355 District Libraries.

- b. Developing 31 website templates for the provincial libraries (<http://perpusmitra.pnri.go.id>).
- c. Developing 6 Centers of Excellence of Library Services which are focusing on cultural local contents in 6 Provincial Libraries in Riau (focusing on Malay culture), East Kalimantan (focusing on Dayak and other tribes cultures in Kalimantan island), Yogyakarta (focusing on Javanese, Sundanese, Madura and other tribes in Java and Madura island), Bali (focusing on Balinese and Sasak cultures in Bali and Lombok island), South Sulawesi (focusing on Bugis, Mandar and other tribes cultures in Sulawesi island) and East Nusa Tenggara Province (focusing on Melanesian and Austronesia cultures in East Nusa Tenggara, Papua and Maluku island).

## 7. Collaborations with Other National Institutions

Taking the role as a guiding library for national scope, NLI has been doing collaborations with other libraries, especially those under regional governments. Some of the collaborations are as follows:

- a. Developing District and Village Libraries including libraries in small islands, coastal and border areas
  - Developing District Libraries  
NLI started from 2007 up to 2013 has granted 450 District Libraries out of the 497 district libraries with small amount of stimulant budget in the form grant delivered in 3 consecutive years. The grant is aiming to develop their collections, provide hardware and software as well as brain ware.
  - Developing Village Libraries  
To support the national programs of community reading habit improvement and facilitating public information access, NLI started from 2007 up to 2013 has developed and/or supported 16.692 out of 61.662 village libraries with books related to their need, library facilities, and technical training. The program will be continued by NLI up to 2014
  - Developing Libraries in Small Islands, Coastal and Border Regions  
In implementing this program, NLI started from 2009 has supported 160 libraries in small islands/border regions and 50 libraries in coastal areas.
- b. Developing mobile and floating libraries
  - NLI started from 2004 until July 2013 has distributed 503 mobile libraries to 33 provincial and 347 district libraries, including 8 floating libraries for 7 provinces.
  - NLI Started from 2006 till now has 4 units of e-Mobile Library which served of school and jail house surrounding Jakarta.
