Thus the National Library serves as a permanent repository of all reading and information materials produced in India, all printed materials authored by Indians and materials concerning India irrespective of language, nationality of author and place of publication. In accordance with the Delivery of Books and Newspapers (Public Libraries) Act 1954, all Indian publishers publishing in any language are legally bound to deposit one copy of the publication to the library.
