

## 7. Legality Check

(Viewing the Transmitted Materials)

The Digitized Contents Transmission Service for Libraries provided by the National Diet Library (“NDL”) is governed by the laws of Japan.

Under the Copyright Law of Japan, it is legal for the NDL to digitize its library materials, including those within the copyright protection period, and provide approved institutions with digitized materials via the internet without permission from copyright holders. These digitized materials provided by the NDL must be hard-to-find materials, such as out-of-print books, which are confirmed through appropriate procedures. It is also legal in Japan for approved institutions to provide these materials to their users.

However, in principle these laws do not apply in foreign countries, and digitized materials provided by the NDL are protected overseas by local laws and international copyright treaties. Therefore, you need to check whether the following act is legal or not in your own country:
